Nursing Shortage and Hiring Efforts

Registered nurses are the largest professional group within the healthcare workforce. They serve today as they have throughout the years as a vital part of our healthcare system. The demand for their services has never been greater.

Several factors contribute to the shortage that is expected to intensify as the need for healthcare grows. These factors include:

- Nursing school enrollment not growing fast enough to meet the demand for registered nurses;
- A shortage of nursing school faculty restricting admissions;
- · An RN workforce nearing retirement age; and
- Insufficient staffing impacting stress levels of nurses and job satisfaction, resulting in some leaving the profession.

We are aware of the impact nurse staffing has on patient care as well as the toll the lack of staffing takes on staff morale. Although there are national initiatives underway to assist with this problem, i.e., the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's "Campaign for Nursing's Future," it doesn't help in the short run when nurses are battling at the bedside to just "survive." The good news is that in the state of Indiana our supply is expected to exceed the demand by 14,000 in the year 2030 (HRSA Health Workforce, Supply and Demand Projections of the Nursing Workforce: 2014-2030, July 21, 2017).

THANK YOU. AND WE ARE TRYING

To all of our nurses, we want to say thank you for enduring and continuing to serve your patients and community through this shortage. We want you to know that we are trying and we want to make things better.

Below is a listing of the steps we have taken locally to combat this issue:

HIRING STATISTICS

- 2017: Filled 118 RN positions
- Jan 1 through June 30 2018: Filled 67 RN positions (On pace for the year to hire 134 RN positions)
- Agency nurses: Currently have 15 agency staff in Lafayette to fill nursing positions
- Working with a recruiting firm to perform nationwide search for RNs. In Dec. 2017, we placed a request for 20 RNs, and YTD have only hired one as a result. This speaks to how hard it is nationally to find RNs.

RECRUITMENT ACTIVITIES

2017

- · Focus groups with key stakeholders for recruitment: Nursing, Environmental Services and Food & Nutrition
- Applicant tracking system software changed: Provides greater exposure on major job boards and allows for mobile applications
- · Attended job fairs: Ivy Tech, Purdue, Ball State, Indiana State University, and locations in Indianapolis, Ohio, Kokomo
- St. Elizabeth School of Nursing (SON) initiative Having a recruiter in SON Atrium at our Central Campus
- · Held three onsite hiring events and invited registered nurses throughout Indiana to attend.
- Advertised open house and open positions on Pandora, ran online ads, sent direct mail invitations, ran TV commercials and bilboards

2018

- · Asking new hires for referrals
- · Contacted former employees to educate about 6 month return policy
- Social media campaigns: Facebook (livestream video, ads, evnts and posts), LinkedIN, Instagram (ads and posts) and Twitter (tweets)
- Recruitment for 3 West: Held town hall forums for current staff; hosted public open house for May graduates and sent direct mail to nurses
- · Corporate launched recruiting commercial featuring some of our nurses to air on major TV channels across Indiana
- Four onsite hiring events
- · Attended job fairs at Ivy Tech, Kokomo and Indianapolis
- · Collaborating with St. Elizabeth SON to develop program to enhance RN skills while still a student nurse
- Upcoming career fairs: Aug. 28 at Lafayette East from 4:30-7 p.m. in the cafeteria; Sept. 12 in Crawfordsville from 4:30-7 p.m. in Bonzel Hall

Positions are posted and Human Resources is trying to hire! Managers have open requisitions for hiring; therefore, it isn't a question of restricting hiring but rather having a sufficient pool to hire from. The goal is to hire enough nurses to cover all of our beds. While acceptable agency nurses are in short supply; agency staff has increased as well. Blocking beds and holding patients in the ED are two of our most undesirable operational challenges. From a global perspective, many things have to be considered inclusive of environmental services, the hospitalist program, ICCR rounding, ratio of new to experienced nurses, time to adequately orient new nursesy and cath lab volume.

All of your efforts are appreciated. Human Resources and Nursing Administration are working to find solutions to this issue. We would encourage you to utilize our Franciscan mission and values to encourage other nurses to join our staff.


Pediatric Center has moved

Wednesday, July 18, the Pediatric Center relocated to its newly renovated space in the Franciscan Health Center for Women & Children.

For the safety of our Pediatric patients, the glass door at the back of the building (Entrance #32 across from the ambulance entrance) will now be ENTRANCE ONLY for physicians and staff. You will still be able to scan your badge to enter – but for the safety of the children in this area – the door will no longer be able to be used as an exit. The door will be locked down at all times and will only be able to open in an emergency after a 15 second delay. Staff that wish to exit the building in this area will need to go through the double doors and take the exit on the right side of the hall. There is a large red exit sign about 20 feet down the hall to mark the exit.

Please keep in mind when traveling throughout the hospital that the Pediatric Unit is a limited access unit. We ask that physicians and staff not cut though the Pediatric Center, but instead use the Center for Women & Children interior hallways to reach the cafeteria, LDRP pods or other areas of the hospital.
